4.2 Computerization of administration and library

An international software 'GREEN STONE' which serves as digital library cum institutional repository has been installed which provides access digital literature in various subjects.

A library management software package "BOOKMAGIC" with SQL server as back engine had been installed in 2003. The features are OPAC, Management module, Circulation module, Stock verification, View status, Barcode, etc.

OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue): OPAC module offers a wide range of flexibility by using different search options. (By author, title, subject, keyword, Publisher, Call number, etc.). The students can see the holdings of the library and easily locate the documents they want.

VIEW STATUS : View status is used to view the status of the library resources and borrowers. The students can check whether the needed documents are available in the library or loaned out.

Computerized circulation with barcoding technology All the books in the library and identity cards of the students have been barcoded. By using the orbit scanner the students can get the books issued and returned within a few seconds.

Electronic Journals Access to more than 6000 electronic journals (Full text) and 97000 e-books are being provided to staff and students under NLIST programme (Abridged form of INFLIBNET, exclusively designed for college libraries) of UGC. Teachers, Research Scholars and Post Graduate students have been provided individual username and password so that they can use this facility in the campus as well as outside.

24 Teachers from our College are acting as members of Board of studies in Kannur University. They are actively involved in the process of updating the syllabus . 11 Teachers participated in Work shop conducted by the Kerala State Higher Education Council for restructuring of CCSS curriculum for Undergraduate Studies.

CCSS system was changed from the present direct grading pattern into indirect Grading with marks. This will be followed from 2014 -15 academic year onwards. Post Graduate Curriculum was also restructured in to CCSS System with indirect grading pattern. The P.G Curriculum will be implimented from 2014 -15 academic year onwards.

Out of 71 teachers in the college 19 are with PhD degree . They are actively participating research related activities . 4 Teachers were placed as research guide in Kannur University this year. Botany and Chemistry departments are research Centres of Kannur University. Department of Botany is recognised as the Centre for Coursework for PhD in Botany

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

During the academic year 144 books, 145 reference, 52 CDs were added to the college library. The College library is automated and the information regarding availability of books, issue details, etc is available to the students and staff.

An online public access catalogue (OPAC) is implemented to enable the students for speedy and convenient access to the library catalogue. A software, Green stone which serves as digital library cum institutional repository has also been installed.

Students and staff have access to INFLIBNET facility.

Orientation programme for newly appointed teachers were given by IQAC at the beginning of their service.

Kerala state Higher Education Council selected a teacher as a FLAIRE member, a capacity building programme of for newly appointed teachers and has been given induction training programme of KSHEC

The faculty and staff recruitment is done on the basis of merit. The vacancies arising at different points of time are notified in news papers and applications are received. The selection committee consists of subject experts nominated by the

University, Government nominees, principal and management representatives. The selection process is thus completed according to government rules. Preference is given to NET qualified candidates while selecting guest faculties.
