 ${\bf 15. Multidisciplinary}\ /\ interdisciplinary$

Sir Syed College, affiliated with Kannur University in Kerala, adheres strictly to the university's regulations, which currently prohibit the development of multidisciplinary courses. Additionally, lacking autonomous status, the college must adhere to the university's prescribed scheme, syllabi, and curriculum for all undergraduate and postgraduate programs. However, within these constraints, the institution has endeavored to introduce a multidisciplinary approach through open courses. Each department offers a range of open courses (typically three to five), allowing students the freedom to choose based on their interests. Remarkably, the complementary courses offered for undergraduate programs adopt a unique multidisciplinary approach. For instance, complementary courses for programs like B.A. Economics include Mathematics, B.Sc. Forestry includes Chemistry, and B.A. Functional English includes Journalism. This approach stands out from other affiliated colleges of the University. Moreover, our persistent efforts led to the approval of a new, professional, interdisciplinary course, Bachelor of Multi Media and Communication (BMMC), by the Government of Kerala and Kannur University in 2020. Notably, eligibility for this course is open to students from science, commerce, and humanities backgrounds. The BMMC curriculum encompasses a wide array of job opportunities in print, online, broadcast, and visual media, as well as in art and cultural studies. Sir Syed College stands alone as the sole institution offering the BMMC course within Kannur University, thereby elevating its status in the higher education landscape.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Kannur University has established a Credit Bank in line with the objectives outlined in the New Education Policy to enhance the flexibility, accessibility, and quality of higher education. Upon admission to affiliated colleges, all students are automatically registered with the university's Credit Bank. The university grants stakeholders a degree of autonomy to re-enroll in undergraduate (UG) and postgraduate (PG) courses at the beginning of semesters, provided they adhere to university regulations. Students are permitted to temporarily discontinue their studies for valid reasons, with their previous academic achievements factored into the evaluation process upon resumption. Kannur University is actively undertaking initiatives to implement the NEP 2020, including the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) framework.

17.Skill development:

The College's various departments have organized skill development add-on courses and certificate programs, alongside

workshops, seminars, and competitions, aligning with the principles of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. These initiatives aim to enhance vocational training, fostering holistic growth and improving employability in emerging industries. Notably, the Department of Forestry has established a partnership with Western India Plywoods Ltd, Kannur, signing an MoU to provide student training in Wood Technology. Afew of the programmes are:

While the college retains limited autonomy in curriculum modification, we have initiated programs aimed at fostering an appreciation for the Indian Knowledge System among our students.

Vedic Mathematics Workshops: Offering workshops and courses on Vedic Mathematics, an ancient Indian system of mathematics that provides efficient and simplified methods for mathematical calculations.

Traditional Indian Medicine (Ayurveda) Workshops: Organizing workshops and seminars on Ayurveda, traditional Indian medicine, focusing on holistic health practices, herbal remedies, and lifestyle principles for overall well-being.

Traditional Indian Cuisine and Nutrition: Introducing classes and

exhibitions on traditional Indian cuisine, culinary techniques, and nutrition based on Ayurvedic principles, emphasizing the importance of a balanced and healthy diet.

Traditional Indian Textiles and Crafts: Exhibition cum sale on traditional Indian textiles, handicrafts, and artisanal practices, exploring the historical, cultural, and economic significance of various crafts across India.

These programs can help students gain a deeper understanding and appreciation of India's diverse cultural heritage and knowledge systems, enriching their academic experience and promoting interdisciplinary learning.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Sir Syed College has a systematic method for analyzing the learning levels of students. Direct as well as indirect methods are used to identify the level of understanding of students.

Direct methods of evaluation include homework, Internal examinations, quizzes, assignments, seminars, and group discussions and indirect methods are external examinations, student surveys, counseling, and mentoring programs. Based on the analysis, programs were organized separately for slow as well as advanced learners which include Scholar Support Programmes (SSP), Remedial Coaching, Mentoring, Personal Counseling, and Bridge Courses. Remedial coaching is given to those who have arrears in previous semesters and to those who try to improve their already published result. With the support of the Department of Higher Education, the Scholar Support Programme (SSP) was arranged for the weaker section of students as an additional measure to improve their study level. Bridge courses were given to the beginners of each program to make them well-acquainted with the subject. Advanced learners were given motivation and mentoring programs to maintain their level of performance. The question bank is available on the official website of the college which can be accessed by the students at any time. Study materials were posted in the form of reading materials, audio, and video forms in MOODLE- the Learning Management System of the college. The student satisfaction survey is conducted at the end of each year to identify the outcome of the classes and their level of understanding.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Sir Syed College has a distinct learning methodology in the

process. The college is engaging the students in hands-on experiences in classrooms, laboratories, and outside. We provide facilities for the students to apply the theories to practical situations. It is a kind of experiential learning. As a method of participative learning students are given opportunities to actively participate in various sessions of the teaching-learning process. Teachers arrange Debates, Group Discussions, Quizzes, and seminar presentations within and outside the classrooms in which students get a chance to be a part of the program and acquire skills of communication, leadership, decision making, and understanding of new concepts. Assignments are given for each subject in each semester which equips the students to collect and analyze materials from different sources such as books, journals, websites, etc. Brainstorming sessions also form part of the learning process. Laboratories are there for practicing the practical sessions of different disciplines. Students are given a project, which they could complete either individually or jointly. It helps them to identify, analyze, evaluate and solve the problems.

Information and Communication Technology is now considered as an indispensable tool and Sir Syed College follows ICT as a part of the teaching and learning process. It helps in providing the resources andknowledgebase for students and enhances better learning outcomes. Whiteboards and smart boards are installed in classrooms. LCD projectors enable the teachers to explain and deliver the contents in attractive ways. The college has implemented Learning Management System (LMS) via 'Moodle' to make the learning process inblended mode both online and offline since the pandemic period. The facultiesdeliversthe classes with the support of ICT tools. The faculties also use other online platforms such as Google classrooms and blogs as toolsfor imparting knowledge. With the support of these platforms study notes, video presentations, audio files and power point presentations and live sessions are delivered to students. The College has an unique method to collect all stakeholder's feedback online. Online feedback is collected periodically from students regarding their opinions and suggestions about college, teachers and curriculum. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college offers 14 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate, and 4 Ph.D. programs across 17 departments with 67 spacious and well-equipped classrooms. Each department is modernized with projectors and highspeed internet access. The campus is divided into four blocks: Southern, Eastern, Western, and Northern. The Western block houses the administrative office, principal's cabin, management room, IQAC room, language and science departments, student support room, and labs. The Southern block includes the forestry lab, instrumentation room, physics department, and seminar hall. The Eastern block hosts the central library, science, and commerce departments. The Northern block features the newly constructed PG and research block. Additional facilities include a 2500-seat auditorium, indoor stadium, multi-gym, canteen, multimedia lab, and RUSA-funded audiovisual theatre. There is also a student center, large playground with a pavilion, and ample parking. The library is well-stocked with various books, reports, e-books, and e-journals, along with a DST-FIST e-learning center. The campus is landscaped with a botanical garden named 'Hortus Sir Syedicus' and a newly constructed bio space. Waste management is efficiently handled by dedicated cleaning staff and regular activities by the NSS, NCC, and Bhoomithra Sena Club.

The campus features a multi-station gym, reflecting its commitment to promoting sports and extracurricular activities. The indoor stadium provides infrastructure and instructional facilities for indoor and outdoor games, promoting students' all-round development. Outdoor amenities include a 200-meter track, basketball, volleyball, handball, and throwball courts. The institute has appointed full-time sports personnel to guide and train students in various sports. A 6000 square meter playground accommodates football and cricket, making it one of the largest in Taliparamba. The student center, funded by the PTA, supports extracurricular activities and youth festival practices. The college's infrastructure includes a 2300-seat auditorium for various activities and three seminar halls with digital aids for seminars and cultural programs.

The general library boasts a collection of 403,479 books and subscribes to 110 journals and 6,000 e-journals. Additionally, it has access to 31,35,000 e-journals through Inflibnet. The entire collection has been barcoded and fully automated using software. With a spacious area of 7200 square feet, the library can accommodate up to 300 students simultaneously.

The library's digital database is well-organized with the Book Magic library management system. It is also under CCTV surveillance, ensuring the security of its resources. The college has successfully integrated ICT-based teaching and learning processes, with an e-learning center established at the library equipped with an adequate number of computers and WiFi internet

facilities.

Recently, RUSA funds have been utilized for renovating the infrastructure, adding more space for postgraduate students and research scholars. The library has been modernized and digitalized to support all students. Special sections and facilities are also planned for differently-abled students, enhancing their accessibility to the library's resources.

4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc.

The library facilities undergo regular maintenance, including book binding for damaged books to prevent further deterioration, stock verification for effective monitoring and control, and pest control measures.

The IT infrastructure is managed by the head, technical staff, and IT wing convener, along with department coordinators. With the financial support of the PTA, regular maintenance is conducted to ensure the smooth functioning of the IT facilities.

Classrooms and the conference hall are maintained for cleanliness and infrastructure integrity, with dedicated cleaning staff assigned to each wing to regularly clean these spaces, including the ICT classrooms.

Laboratories maintain login records for equipment and have a separate stock register under the custody of the department head. Lab attenders receive training and regularly maintain laboratory equipment. Instruments purchased under FIST (DST) are installed at the Centralized Instrumentation Facilities (SIF) and are regularly maintained with financial support from the college management and CDMEA.

Other support systems, such as housekeeping for cleanliness of corridors, washrooms, classrooms, laboratories, and premises, are handled by the cleaning staff. Washrooms are sanitized regularly. Power backup facilities, like generators, are maintained by the Internal Electrical Maintenance Department. Water coolers are regularly cleaned and maintained, with the quality of drinking water checked for pH and hardness. Sports facilities are also maintained by the sports committee.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Sir Syed College has a systematic method for analyzing the learning levels of students. Direct as well as indirect methods are used to identify the level of understanding of students. Direct methods of evaluation include homework, Internal examinations, quizzes, assignments, seminars, and group discussions and indirect methods are external examinations, student surveys, counseling, and mentoring programs. Based on the analysis, programs were organized separately for slow as well as advanced learners which include Scholar Support Programmes (SSP), Remedial Coaching, Mentoring, Personal Counseling, and Bridge Courses. Remedial coaching is given to those who have arrears in previous semesters and to those who try to improve their already published result. With the support of the Department of Higher Education, the Scholar Support Programme (SSP) was arranged for the weaker section of students as an additional measure to improve their study level. Bridge courses were given to the beginners of each program to make them well-acquainted with the subject. Advanced learners were given motivation and mentoring programs to maintain their level of performance. The question bank is available on the official website of the college which can be accessed by the students at any time. Study materials were posted in the form of reading

materials, audio, and video forms in MOODLE- the Learning Management System of the college. The student satisfaction survey is conducted at the end of each year to identify the outcome of the classes and their level of understanding.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college offers 14 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate, and 4 Ph.D. programs across 17 departments with 67 spacious and wellequipped classrooms. Each department is modernized with projectors and high-speed internet access. The campus is divided into four blocks: Southern, Eastern, Western, and Northern. The Western block houses the administrative office, principal's cabin, management room, IQAC room, language and science departments, student support room, and labs. The Southern block includes the forestry lab, instrumentation room, physics department, and seminar hall. The Eastern block hosts the central library, science, and commerce departments. The Northern block features the newly constructed PG and research block. Additional facilities include a 2500-seat auditorium, indoor stadium, multi-gym, canteen, multimedia lab, and RUSAfunded audiovisual theatre. There is also a student center, large playground with a pavilion, and ample parking. The library is well-stocked with various books, reports, e-books, and e-journals, along with a DST-FIST e-learning center. The campus is landscaped with a botanical garden named 'Hortus Sir Syedicus' and a newly constructed bio space. Waste management is efficiently handled by dedicated cleaning staff and regular activities by the NSS, NCC, and Bhoomithra Sena Club.

Engaging in sports, particularly in university representation, fosters a positive spirit and can lead to career success, university recognition, and income opportunities. The campus features a multi-station gym, reflecting its commitment to promoting sports and extracurricular activities. The indoor stadium provides infrastructure and instructional facilities for indoor and outdoor games, promoting students' all-round

development. Outdoor amenities include a 200-meter track, basketball, volleyball, handball, and throwball courts. The institute has appointed full-time sports personnel to guide and train students in various sports. A 6000 square meter playground accommodates football and cricket, making it one of the largest in Taliparamba. The student center, funded by the PTA, supports extracurricular activities and youth festival practices. The college's infrastructure includes a 2300-seat auditorium for various activities and three seminar halls with digital aids for seminars and cultural programs.

The general library boasts a collection of 403,479 books and subscribes to 110 journals and 6,000 e-journals. Additionally, it has access to 31,35,000 e-journals through Inflibnet. The entire collection has been barcoded and fully automated using software. With a spacious area of 7200 square feet, the library can accommodate up to 300 students simultaneously.

The library's digital database is well-organized with the Book Magic library management system. It is also under CCTV surveillance, ensuring the security of its resources. The college has successfully integrated ICT-based teaching and learning processes, with an e-learning center established at the library equipped with an adequate number of computers and WiFi internet facilities.

Recently, RUSA funds have been utilized for renovating the infrastructure, adding more space for postgraduate students and research scholars. The library has been modernized and digitalized to support all students. Special sections and facilities are also planned for differently-abled students, enhancing their accessibility to the library's resources.

Any issues within the college network should be reported to the IT centre. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the college has implemented an effective and efficient MOODLE Learning Management System (LMS), with financial support from the college management and PTA. All departments have uploaded online class materials such as video lectures, study materials, and previous question papers onto the LMS. To enhance the LMS, each department is equipped with high-speed internet connections, and each unit has separate login IDs. The library facilities undergo regular maintenance, including book binding for damaged books to prevent further deterioration, stock verification for effective monitoring and control, and pest control measures.

The IT infrastructure is managed by the head, technical staff, and IT wing convener, along with department coordinators. With the financial support of the PTA, regular maintenance is conducted to ensure the smooth functioning of the IT facilities.

Classrooms and the conference hall are maintained for cleanliness and infrastructure integrity, with dedicated cleaning staff assigned to each wing to regularly clean these spaces, including the ICT classrooms.

Laboratories maintain login records for equipment and have a separate stock register under the custody of the department head. Lab attenders receive training and regularly maintain laboratory equipment. Instruments purchased under FIST (DST) are installed at the Centralized Instrumentation Facilities (SIF) and are regularly maintained with financial support from the college management and CDMEA.

Other support systems, such as housekeeping for cleanliness of corridors, washrooms, classrooms, laboratories, and premises, are handled by the cleaning staff. Washrooms are sanitized regularly. Power backup facilities, like generators, are maintained by the Internal Electrical Maintenance Department. Water coolers are regularly cleaned and maintained, with the quality of drinking water checked for pH and hardness. Sports facilities are also maintained by the sports committee.
