The college initially focused on educating the underprivileged, it has now grown significantly, offering 14 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate, and 4 Ph.D. programs to approximately 2200 students.

The 25-acre campus features state-of-the-art facilities, including modern classrooms, research laboratories, a well-stocked library, art studios, performance halls, sports facilities, and student lounges, ensuring a favorable learning environment. The college's distinguished faculty, with a student-to-faculty ratio of 25:1, provides personalized attention and mentorship.

College emphasizes research and innovation, encouraging students and faculty to engage in projects that address real-world challenges. The institution has established research centers and industry collaborations to promote interdisciplinary studies and practical applications of knowledge.

The college offers a vibrant campus life with various extracurricular activities, clubs, and organizations. Cultural events, sports competitions, and community service programs cultivate teamwork, leadership, and social responsibility. The Career Service Center prepares students for successful careers through workshops, job fairs, and networking events.

The college is committed to diversity and inclusion, ensuring a welcoming environment for individuals from all backgrounds. Global exposure is also a priority, with student exchange programs and collaborations enriching the educational experience.

**Infrastructure Management:** Supported by well-established committees and systems for infrastructure maintenance and enhancement, ensuring efficient operation and development.

#### **Student Support and Progression**

Over the years from 2018 to 2024, the college has supported its students through extensive financial aid programs, disbursing over Rs. 3.85 crores in scholarships, free ships, and stipends from central and state government funds, alongside numerous endowments and alumni contributions. The college organizes more than 90 programs annually, focusing on soft skills, language proficiency, and technological trends, benefiting nearly 12,000 students. Guided by a strong moto of ensuring no student is left behind due to financial constraints, the institution also provides comprehensive career guidance and coaching, enabling significant numbers to secure employment and excel in competitive exams like JRF/NET/GATE/JAM. With active student unions, vibrant cultural activities, and ongoing campus developments such as the Biospace garden initiative, the college continues to foster an environment where academic excellence meets personal growth and societal contribution.

Scholarships and Financial Support: Government and non-governmental scholarships covered 84% of students from 2018-2024. Rs. 10,146,681 disbursed from central government funds to 1,483 students. Rs.

27,150,834 disbursed from state government funds to 5,238 students. Various endowments and funds like Dr. T.P. Balakrishnan Memorial, A.K. Kader Kutty Memorial, etc., supported 445 students with Rs. 1,294,117.

**Total Financial Aid:** Rs. 38,591,632 granted as scholarships and free ships during 2018-2024. College policy ensures no student is deprived of education due to inability to pay fees.

**Skill Enhancement and Programs:** Over 90 programs annually enhancing skills like Soft Skills, Language & Communication, etc., for 11,957 students. Coaching for competitive exams, career counseling and skill development are emphasized.

**Career Guidance and Coaching:** 84.68% of students benefited from career guidance and competitive exam coaching.

**Student Progress and Achievements:** 32.47% of students progress to higher education annually. 243 students secured employment, 180 qualified competitive exams like JRF/NET/GATE/JAM.

**Student Activities and Leadership:** NCC/NSS/sports/cultural activities involve students in international, national and state programs. 116 students won awards in sports/cultural activities at various levels.

**Student Union and Alumni Support:** Elected Student Union organizes events, cultural fests, and social awareness campaigns. Alumni association supports scholarships, lectures, and campus projects with Rs. 4,309,285 mobilized.

**Infrastructure and Campus Projects:** SSCOTA (Overseas Alumni) constructed a Biospace garden and Open Air Auditorium (Autograph) on campus with an expenditure of Rs. 35 lakhs.

#### Governance, Leadership and Management

Sir Syed College is governed by the CDMEA, which oversees day-to-day affairs, policies, administrative setup, appointments, and service rules. The principal acts as the executive head, the College Council reviews internal matters, and the IQAC ensures quality improvement. Various Committees and Cells manage academic and extracurricular activities, while the Grievance Redressal System handles grievances. Students participate in various committees, ensuring their participation in all decision-making processes.

**NEP:** As part of the implementation of the NEP-FYUGP in the college, a college-level FYUGP Committee has been constituted, along with a department-level coordinator.

**Covid19 pandemic Management:** The college purchased an LMS-MOODLE, to support teaching and learning activities. Additionally, management provided internet Wi-Fi connections in all departments to ensure smooth academic operations.

**IQAC Initiatives:** The IQAC organizes training programs on research methodology, NEP, Outcome-Based Education, IPR, SPARK and NAAC accreditation. It develops plans, prepares the academic calendar, reviews performance, and ensures e-governance, office automation, and ICT-enabled teaching. # 1.1.1

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

#### **Response:**

The institution adopts **Choice-Based Credit and Semester System** aligned with **Outcome-Based Education** and **NEP** guidelines. The goal is to prepare students to be creative, innovative, research-focused, and employable. The academic coordination committee at Sir Syed College spearheads the organization and supervision of curricular activities, ensuring their successful implementation and effective delivery through careful planning.

- Faculty members participate in curriculum design and updates at the university by serving as **members of the Board of Examinations, Board of Studies, Syndicate, Senate, Academic Council**, and as **coordinators of the four-year UG program**. They also act as question setters and external examiners.
- The **academic committee** plays a vital role in shaping the institution's vision, mission and academic plans which includes developing curricular and co-curricular activities and designing the **academic calendar** which is published on the website including **PO**, **PSO and CO**. Each department prepares a **teaching plan** based on the academic calendar, detailing subject allocations, timetable preparation, internal exams, seminars, workshops, and PTA meetings, and strictly adheres to it.
- An **induction program** is provided to new entrants, where policies and practices are communicated to them. **Bridge courses** are also offered to ease the transition from higher secondary to specific undergraduate courses.
- **The tutorial system** acts as a vital communication link between teachers, students, and parents, addressing student issues to promote a supportive learning environment.
- The availability of physical facilities for both curricular and co-curricular activities, such as ICTenabled classrooms, libraries, advanced laboratories, hostels, restrooms, gardens, museums, indoor stadium, auditoriums, and digital infrastructure like IT Labs, Wi-Fi, e-resources, and smart boards, enhances instructional capabilities.
- Departments offer Value Added Courses, Certificate Courses, and Add-on Courses to help students gain diverse skills and knowledge. A total of 54 courses were completed by 1951 students, while 299 students enrolled in online courses like SWAYAM, COURSERA, and IIRS Outreach programs.
- **Experiential learning**, such as industry visits, seminars, workshops, project and hands-on sessions, engages students directly to enhance knowledge and skill development purposefully.
- **Remedial coaching** offers personalized educational support to students in overcoming learning obstacles in specific subjects and helps students achieve academic success. Programs catering to both advanced and slower learners are provided through initiatives known as **WWS** and the **Scholar Support Program.**

- Students undergo evaluation through **test papers, internal exams, model exams, seminars, assignments, viva voce and discussions**. Additionally, they participate in workshops, debates, group discussions, panel discussions, exhibitions, competitions, paper presentations, and management fests. According to the academic calendar, **internal exams are centrally managed** at the college level by the Internal Examination Committee. A **question bank** for all subjects is accessible both in the library and on the website.
- All students engage in **project work** as essential part of the curriculum. **Student exchange programs, faculty exchange programs, and industrial visits** provide new learning opportunities for students.
- Skill development programs and entrepreneurship development programs are provided to students through various clubs like the ED Club and IEDC.
- Merit awards and recognitions for achievements in both curricular, co-curricular activities, scholarships and endowments from Government, Management, P.T.A., Department and Alumni serve as strong motivators for students to strive for higher accomplishments.
