The College implements a Choice-Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS) aligned with
Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and NEP 2020 guidelines, fostering students who are creative,
innovative, research-focused, and highly employable. Academic Committee leads the planning,
organization, and supervision of curricular activities, ensuring smooth and effective implementation.
Faculty members contribute to curriculum design and updates at the university level, holding roles
on the Board of Examinations, Board of Studies, Syndicate, Senate, Academic Council, and as
coordinators for the four-year undergraduate program. They also serve as question setters and
external examiners, playing a pivotal role in upholding academic standards.

The Academic Committee is responsible for developing the academic calendar, which is made available on the college website along with Program Outcomes (PO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course Outcomes (CO). Departments create a detailed teaching plan based on the academic calendar, including subject assignments, timetable preparation, internal exams, seminars, workshops, and PTA meetings. New students participate in a comprehensive induction program that introduces them to institutional policies and practices, and bridge courses are offered to ease their transition from higher secondary education to undergraduate studies. The tutorial system fosters strong communication between teachers, students, and parents, creating a supportive learning environment and addressing student needs proactively.

The college offers state-of-the-art physical and digital facilities, enhancing both curricular and cocurricular learning experiences. Resources include ICT-enabled classrooms, a well-equipped library, advanced laboratories, hostels, restrooms, gardens, museums, an indoor stadium, auditoriums, IT labs, campus-wide Wi-Fi, e-resources, and smart boards. Departments also offer a range of Value-Added Courses, Certificate Courses, and Add-on Courses to broaden students' skill sets and knowledge base. A total of 54 courses have been completed by 1,951 students, while 299 students have participated in online courses such as SWAYAM, Coursera, and IIRS Outreach programs. Experiential learning opportunities, including industry visits, seminars, workshops, projects, and hands-on sessions, encourage students to apply knowledge directly in practical settings.

To support students facing academic challenges, remedial coaching is available, offering personalized assistance to help them achieve academic success. Advanced and slower learners are further supported through the Walk With a Scholar (WWS) initiative and the Scholar Support Program (SSP), respectively.

Assessment methods include test papers, internal exams, model exams, seminars, assignments, viva voce, and discussions, alongside workshops, debates, group discussions, panel discussions, exhibitions, competitions, paper presentations, and management fests. Internal exams are centrally managed by the college's Internal Examination Committee, and a question bank for all subjects is accessible both in the library and on the college website.

Project work is an integral component of the curriculum, and students gain additional learning opportunities through student and faculty exchange programs and industrial visits. Skill development and entrepreneurship programs are offered through clubs such as the Entrepreneurship Development (ED) Club and Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC). The college further motivates students by recognizing their achievements in both curricular and co-curricular activities with merit awards, scholarships, and endowments from government sources, management, the PTA, departments, and alumni.

According to the academic calendar, internal exams are centrally managed at the college level by the Internal Examination Committee. A question bank for all subjects is accessible both in the library and on the website. All students engage in project work as essential part of the curriculum. Student exchange programs, faculty exchange programs, and industrial visits provide new learning opportunities for students. Skill development programs and entrepreneurship development programs are provided to students through various clubs like the ED Club and IEDC.

Sir Syed College, strategically located in a highly accessible area, stands as a beacon of academic excellence, offering state-of-the-art infrastructure and diverse facilities to foster teaching, learning, and research. Spanning a 25-acre campus, the institution is equipped with modern amenities catering to the comprehensive needs of students, faculty, and researchers.

Academic and Research Infrastructure

The college features **65 classrooms**, of which **38 are ICT-enabled** with Smart TVs, LCD projectors, LMS, and WiFi. The **Golden Jubilee Postgraduate and Research Block**, covering **27,800 sq. ft.** across three stories, accommodates **13 science labs**, **6 research labs**, and **5 research scholars' rooms**. Designed with inclusivity in mind, the campus is **Divyangjan-friendly**.

Computing and Digital Facilities

Modern technology is integrated into academics with specialized labs such as the **Data Analysis Centre**, **E-Learning Centre**, **Multimedia Lab**, and the **Computational Chemistry Lab**. Language labs equipped with audio-visual aids further enhance digital learning.

Libraries and Study Areas

The **Central Library** serves as the intellectual hub of the college, complemented by the **Intellectual Discourse Space (IDiS)**, a mini-auditorium designed to promote collaborative learning.

Multimedia and Cultural Spaces

Multimedia facilities include a **200-seated audio-visual theatre**, the **Satyajit Ray Media Hall**, and a **Multimedia Lab with an editing studio**. Cultural activities thrive in the **2000-seater auditorium**, **RUSA Seminar Hall**, and eco-friendly spaces such as **'Aranyakam' (Eco-classroom)**, **'Parijatham' (Resting area for girls)**, and **'Njaval Koottam' (Open assembly space)**.

Sports and Recreation

Sports facilities include a **multipurpose indoor stadium** with courts for badminton, basketball, volleyball, and table tennis, alongside combat sports and yoga facilities. Outdoor amenities feature a football and cricket ground, **200-meter mud track**, tennis and basketball courts, and dedicated spaces for volleyball, softball, kho-kho, kabaddi, handball, and ball badminton. The **Warm-Up Woodland Path** offers a serene environment for fitness.

Administrative and Support Facilities

The college employs **semi-automated administrative systems** for streamlined admissions and academic management. Amenities include the **Employees Co-operative Society**, **students' co-operative store**, **Career Guidance Satellite Centre**, **P Muhammed Ali Foundation**, and the **Job Station (Govt. of Kerala)**.

Sir Syed College upholds a robust and systematic approach to maintaining and utilizing its physical, academic, and support facilities, ensuring a conducive environment for learning, research, and extracurricular activities. The institution's commitment to sustainability, accessibility, and efficiency is reflected in its policies and procedures, which are designed to promote optimal functionality, longevity, and equitable access to resources.

Physical Infrastructure Maintenance

The upkeep of the college's extensive infrastructure, which spans 25 acres, is managed through a structured maintenance plan. A dedicated **Campus Maintenance Committee** oversees routine inspections and implements necessary repairs and upgrades. This includes regular servicing of classrooms, administrative offices, laboratories, and residential spaces to ensure they remain functional and safe.

The college employs skilled personnel for tasks such as cleaning, painting, plumbing, and electrical work, while major repairs are outsourced to professional contractors. Regular audits of facilities, including the **multipurpose indoor stadium**, sports fields, and ICT-enabled classrooms, are conducted to identify wear and tear and prioritize interventions. The institution adopts Choice-Based Credit and Semester System aligned with Outcome-Based Education and NEP guidelines. The goal is to prepare students to be creative, innovative, research-focused, and employable.

- Faculty members participate in curriculum design and updates at the university by serving as members of the Board of Examinations, Board of Studies, Syndicate, Senate, Academic Council, and as coordinators of the four-year UG program. They also act as question setters and external examiners.
- The academic committee plays a vital role in shaping the institution's vision, mission andacademic plans which includes developing curricular and co-curricular activities and designing the academic calendar which is published on the website including PO, PSO and CO. Each department prepares a teaching plan based on the academic calendar, detailing subjectallocations, timetable preparation, internal exams, seminars, workshops, and PTA meetings, andstrictly adheres to it.
- An **induction program** is provided to new entrants, where policies and practices arecommunicated to them. **Bridge courses** are also offered to ease the transition from higher secondary to specific undergraduate courses.
- The **tutorial system** acts as a vital communication link between teachers, students, and parents, addressing student issues to promote a supportive learning environment.
- The availability of physical facilities for both curricular and co-curricular activities, such as **ICT-enabled classrooms**, libraries, advanced laboratories, hostels, restrooms, gardens, museums,indoor stadium, auditoriums, and digital infrastructure like IT Labs, Wi-Fi, e-resources, andsmart boards, enhances instructional capabilities.

Specialized premarital counseling sessions have been introduced to educate students and their families about the significance of completing their education before committing to marital responsibilities. These sessions aim to shift societal perceptions and prioritize education as a vital stepping stone to personal and professional success.

Once the allotment is finalized, students visit the college on the specified date, as mentioned in the allotment memo, to complete the admission

process. They submit the necessary documents at the college office to formalize their enrollment. The entire procedure, being conducted online, ensures transparency and eliminates any scope for malpractice.

Sir Syed College, being a **minority institution**, has a specific **minority quota** for admissions. This quota is also merit-based, ensuring deserving students from the minority community have access to quality education. Additionally, for students who may not qualify under the general merit list but are keen on pursuing their studies, the institution provides a **management quota**. This enables academically inclined but less meritorious students to gain admission based on their interest and commitment to learning.

The allocation of seats at the college is structured to ensure inclusivity and representation from diverse sections of society. The distribution is as follows: **40% for general merit**, **20% for Muslim merit**, **20% for management quota**, and **20% reserved for SC/ST categories**. Beyond these categories, the college also admits students under special quotas such as the **sports quota**, where talented athletes are given opportunities to further their education, and the **differently-abled quota**, ensuring accessibility for students with disabilities. Additionally, a special provision exists for students from the **Lakshadweep Islands**, encouraging participation from remote regions and promoting diversity within the campus.

The institution places significant emphasis on merit and inclusivity, reflecting its commitment to academic excellence and social responsibility. By accommodating various quotas and providing opportunities for students across different socio-economic backgrounds, Sir Syed College ensures that no deserving student is left behind. The online and centralized nature of the process underscores its transparency and efficiency, reinforcing trust in the system.
