

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COLLEGE PROFILE

Sir Syed College, was established in 1967 by a handful of educational visionaries of Kannur under CDMEA (Cannanore District Muslim Educational Association) with a vision to impart moral and liberal education to the public, especially socio politically backward minority communities of North Malabar region. The college, named after Sir Syed Ahmed Khan, the founder of Aligarh Muslim University, was started in 1967 as a junior college under the University of Kerala. It came under the University of Calicut in 1968 and under the Kannur University in 1996. The institution was reaccredited by NAAC with A grade in 2017. Today Sir Syed College is one of the biggest post graduate institutions under Kannur University. The college at present offers Under Graduate programmes in Botany, Chemistry, Forestry, Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Zoology, Arabic, Economics, Functional English, History, Malayalam and Commerce; Post Graduate programmes in Arabic, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Commerce. Apart from that the departments of Botany and Chemistry are research centres as well.

The college has a strength of about 1680 students, 71 teaching staff and 35 non teaching staff. 15 of the teachers are Ph.D holders and 21 have M.Phil degree. There are 13 research guides attached to the research departments of Chemistry and Botany and 33 research scholars and one post doctoral fellow is working under them. 13 scholars have been awarded Ph.D from these research centres so far (11 Botany, 3 Chemistry). Many teachers are engaged in minor and major research projects funded by various agencies. The members of the faculty have contributed extensively to literatures in their respective fields. 9 books have been published by the teachers out of which one has attained national award. About 375 research papers of teachers and students have been published in various international and national journals. The Publication division of the college publishes the research journal, SEARCH. The college boasts of an extensive library with more than 41000 books, 25 research journals and INFLIBNET facility. The other facilities offered by the college include Sir Syed IT Centre, UGC aided

Coaching Centre, Career Guidance and Counselling Cell, Photostat Centre, Gymnasium, Health Club, Sports Pavilion, Ladies Retreat room etc. There are separate hostels for men and women. An indoor stadium funded by UGC is in the final stages of construction. An ambitious project of the institution, the PG and Research block as GOLDEN JUBILEE BUILDING with four floors, is under construction.

The students are provided ample opportunities for co curricular and extra curricular activities through National Cadet Corps, National Service Scheme and different clubs like Language Club, Farm Club, Forestry Club, Hindi Club. E D Club, Film Club, Music Club, Tourism Club, Literary Club, Media Club Cultural Forum, Arts Forum, Science Forum etc. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Tutorial Scheme, Grievance Redressal Cell, Parent Teachers Association, College Co-Operative Society etc. ensure that the students get an ideal environment congenial to bring out the best in them. The college office ensures that maximum number of students get scholarships and endowments. Presently more than half the strength of students are enjoying the benefits of different scholarships and endowments.

Hortus Sir Syedicus, the district medicinal plants demonstration garden developed by the Garden Club and NSS with the financial aid of State Medicinal Plants Board is one of a kind under the Kannur University. Sir Syed College is a front runner in academics with the maximum number of students becoming toppers year after year. The college has also left its mark on account of its envious success, excellent performance and participation in the arts festivals and many a time students from this institution have represented the University and state at sports meets across the country.

The institution is extremely proud that in its 51 years of glorious existence it has stood true to its mission of changing the social fabric of North Malabar region. The role played by Sir Syed College is undeniable and pivotal in the cultural, political, economic and social uprising and development of the region.



GENERAL RULES

ADMISSION

U.G. & P.G. Courses

Application for U.G., P.G. admission is through Kannur University centralised online platform. Those who seek admission in Muslim/ Management/ Sports quota should submit the printout of the online application with supporting documents. Candidates who have passed plus two or equivalent examination recognized by the Kannur University are eligible for UG, PG admission. For registration and details visit www.cap.kannuruniversity.ac.in. There is compulsory uniform for first and second year students except on Wednesdays

U.G. Course

- Application for P.G. admission is through Kannur University centralised online platform except Muslim merit, Management and Sports quota. Candidates who have completed graduation are eligible for P. G admission. For registration and details visit www.cap. kannuruniversity.ac.in
- 2. Application form and prospectus can be had from the College office.
- 3. A rank list will be published by the University online.
- 4. Applicants who are provisionally selected for admission shall be enrolled only when they produce all the certificates mentioned in the prospectus and pay the first term fee. Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate without assigning reason thereof.
- 5. Any candidate who is found to have secured admission by false representation will be sent away and shall forfeit the fee paid.

COLLECTION OF FEE

- 1. The tuition fee can be paid in two installments on the days noted in the calendar. This may also be remitted in lump sum in advance.
- The special fee, caution deposit etc. should be paid along with the first installment of tuition fee on the day of admission. Students of senior classes should remit the same within seven days from the reopening of the College.
- 3. If any student fails to pay the fee on the due date, he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 5/- along with the fee on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be counted as the 10th day.

- 4. If the fee with a fine of Rs.5/- is not paid on or before the 10th day after the due date, a fine of Rs. 10/-will have to be paid.
- 5. If the fee and fine are not paid before the last opportunity, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College. He / she will not be eligible for attendance until he / she is re-admitted. If he /she is to be re-admitted he /she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and remit Rs.50/- as re-admission fee.
- 6. Full fee concession is granted to students belonging to the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other eligible communities. Students belonging to other backward communities and forward castes shall produce necessary Income, Nativity and Community Certificates at the time of admission.
- 7. Other Backward Community students who leave the College during the middle of the academic year are not eligible for fee concession and they have to pay all fee due at the time of their leaving.
- 8. Students from other Universities shall pay the matriculation and recognition fee at the time of admission and apply for recognition of the qualifying examination.

CAUTION DEPOSIT

- 1. The caution deposit will be refunded to the students only after the completion of the course or when the students leave the institution. They should produce the original receipt issued at the time of admission.
- 2. All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be preferred before the reopening date of the next academic year. After this time limit the names of those who have not claimed the deposit will be published in the dailies and if the claim for refund is not preferred within two months from the publication, the whole amount due to the student shall be permanently forfeited and the same will be remitted to the Government.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

- 1. Application for Transfer Certificate should be made in the prescribed form at least two days in advance.
- Conduct Certificate will be issued only along with the Transfer Certificate when the student has completed the course.
 A late fee of Rs.50/- will be collected from those who apply for T.C. after one year of his / her leaving the College. The date of leaving the College will ordinarily be the last day he/ she attended the College.
 A fine of Rs.100/- will have to be paid for the issue of duplicate T.C.
 Duplicate T.C. will be issued only on the production of an affidavit signed before a First Class Judicial Magistrate.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

- 1. Every student shall put in a minimum attendance of 75% of term days.
- 2. Students are not permitted to absent themselves from classes without leave. Leave applications should be submitted to the Principal in advance through the class Tutor/ Head of the Department.
- 3. Absence from a class for one period of either of the two sessions will be considered as absence for half a day.
- 4. Applications for leave on medical grounds shall be supported by a medical certificate.
- 5. A student absenting from the College with or without leave for more than five consecutive working days shall report to the Principal before attending any class.
- 6. If a student absents himself/herself from the College for more than 15 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation, his/her name will be removed from the rolls.
- 7. Promotion to the higher class next semester and presenting them for University Examination shall be subject to the following conditions:
 - a) The student should have earned at least three fourth of the attendance prescribed by the College for the course during the semester.
 - b) He/she should have completed the course to the satisfaction of the College authorities and his/her progress, conduct and character should have been satisfactory.
- 8 Students seeking exemption from the rules related to minimum attendance shall apply for exemption to the University. The reason for each day's absence is to be explained. In the case of absence on account of illness, a medical certificate has also to be furnished.
- 9. The semester certificate of attendance required by the University for University Examinations will not be granted unless the Principal is satisfied that the student's conduct and progress have been satisfactory and the student has attended the class three fourths of the working days in the academic semester. Students may also note that unless they register for the University Examinations, they will not be eligible for promotion to higher classes. Students who want to participate in extracurricular and curricular activities will not be granted grace attendance unless they obtain prior written permission from the Principal. Applications for such permission shall be recommended by the teachers concerned.

No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was beyond the student's control. In no case will exemption be granted to the same student for more than 2 time in a course.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

Students are hereby instructed to strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the college. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are expected to read the notice board on a day to day basis. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including dismissal.

IDENTITY CARDS COMPULSORY

All students admitted to the college shall compulsorily wear their identity cards whenever they are present on the college campus. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc. will be made only on production of the identity card. The identity card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate whichever is earlier. Identity Card is valid for one year only.

MOBILE PHONE BANNED

The use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited on the college campus as per Government Order. Offenders will be levied fine and the mobile phone will be confiscated.

MANDATORY DRESS CODE

UG students admitted from 2018 onwards should wear uniform prescribed by the college authorities and on Wednesdays a decent dress, preferably churidar by girl students, pants and shirts by boys. Transparent and exposing clothes, T shirts are to be avoided. Boys shall not tuck their dhoti up while they are on the campus. Students should not cover their face and should reveal their identity while they are on the campus. UG students admitted from 2018 onwards should wear uniform prescribed by the college authorities.

OUTSIDERS NOT PERMITTED

Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the principal. Students shall not bring any outsiders except the parent/guardian to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the principal.

CHARACTER AND CONDUCT

- Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behavior. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.
- 2. Students shall greet both teaching and non teaching staff on the occasion of their first meeting during the day.
- 3. When the Principal or teacher enters a classroom, students shall stand and greet and keep standing till they are asked to sit down.
- 4. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences.
- 5. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms by 9.25 am and should not leave the classes except during intervals.
- 6. When a student wants to enter or leave the classroom while the class is on, he/she shall do so only after getting the permission of the teacher.
- 7. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students should keep silence.
- 8. Students shall not loiter on the verandas or college premises during working hours for any reason whatsoever.
- 9. Students are advised to use the library during free periods.
- 10. Students shall not enter any class other than their own.
- 11. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other students either in words, letters, gestures or by any other means.

RAGGING: A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENCE

Students shall not include in ragging or in any other activities causing harassment or difficulties to the fellow students in the college. Any student involving in ragging will be expelled from the college and have to face penal proceedings in accordance with the provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act of the Govt. of Kerala.

OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Smoking and consumption of alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited on the campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college.

- 2. Students shall not go on tour or picnic or excursion without the written permission of the Principal.
- 3. Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organizing processions, meetings, entertainment programme, functions in the college for collecting funds from the students/staff and for distributing notice or putting up any notice on the notice board.
- 4. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. Intentional causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. The offenders will be penalised for the same and will be liable for recovery of the loss.
- 5. Students shall not write or make any marks on the walls or any part of the college property. If found guilty, they are liable to be punished and the expenses for the repair work will be recovered from the offenders
- 6. A student who has any complaint against any other students, teaching staff or non teaching staff shall represent the same either in writing or orally to the Tutor, HoD, Grievance Redressal Cell and Discipline Committee or to the Principal directly. Such representations can be made by the parents/ quardian of the students also.

MISCONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION

- 1. Students are bound to obey the directions issued from time to time by the Principal, teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct.
- 2. Any student, who is found to have conducted himself/herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the class room on the college premises is liable to be punished as deemed fit by the Principal.
- 3. A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class. If any student is sent out of the class, the teacher and the student shall report the matter to the Principal.
- 4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict punishments such as imposing fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting educational concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of TC without the application from the student or guardian and expulsion from the college.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college has a well equipped library with 41,000 books and 110 journals. The library will be open from 9.00 a.m. to 5 p.m. on all working days including saturdays.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. Identity card issued by the College should be produced at the counter before entering the library.
- 2. Personal articles such as books, bags, umbrellas, files etc. are not allowed in the library.
- 3. Students are allowed to carry only blank sheets of paper and pen to the library.
- 4. Library is a place for serious reading and research. Strict silence should be maintained in the library and its premises.
- 5. Students can borrow books from the library by producing the identity card
- 6. The borrowers should examine the book issued to them and any damage, marking if any, should be reported to the staff before leaving the counter.
- 7. The borrowers will be held responsible for any defect detected when the book is returned and he /she will be liable to replace the defective book with a new one or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Government/University.
- 8. The loan period is normally 14 days. But the Librarian reserves the right to recall any book at any time from any borrower, even when the period of loan is not over.



- The loan period may be extended or shortened at the discretion of the Librarian
- 10. If the book borrowed from the library is not returned on or before the due date, a fine of Re. 1/- (Re. One only) per day will be levied for each book.
- 11. If a book borrowed is lost, the matter should immediately be reported to the Librarian
- 12. If a book is irrecoverably lost, it must be replaced with a new one or the cost as may be fixed by the Government/University should be paid.
- 13. Member shall not sub lend the books of the library.
- 14. All documents borrowed from the Library by the students and the members of the staff should be returned on or before the last working day of the academic year or on the date fixed by the Librarian.
- 15. Any matter not covered by the forgoing rules shall be decided by the principal.

BOOK BANK

- 1. The Book Bank is a separate section of the college library and contains standard text books of all subjects. They are loaned to financially backward students for a period of one year ending on 31st March.
- Books will be issued to deserving students recommended by the Heads of Departments. Those who need the books should apply to the librarian with the recommendation of the Head of the Department, the librarian will issue the books on obtaining acknowledgment in the issue register.
- 3. Generally, a student will be issued only two text books from the book bank.
- 4. If the book is not returned on the prescribed day, a fine of 1 rupee per day will be levied.
- A student is allowed to get the same book renewed for second year on 1st June in case it is so recommended by the Head of the Department.
- 6. Books are to be used with maximum care and there should be no damage or disfigurement. Writing with pencil or ink anywhere in the book is strictly forbidden. If any such thing has been done, the student is liable to replace the book. Books will be received only after page to page scrutiny.

STUDENTS SUPPORT SYSTEMS

Wi-Fi - INTERNET FACILITY

College has become a Wi-Fi campus with high speed Internet connection through optical fibre cabling funded by Department of Science and Technology (DST) FIST Programme and University Grants Commission (UGC) from 2015 onwards. Sir Syed College IT centre & Networking and Computational facilities in the Library are well equipped with computers exclusively set aside for browsing. To promote the use of Internet for academic purpose, students are allowed WiFi access to Internet in their laptop or tablet free of cost. Internet can be accessed on the campus from 9.00am to 5.00 pm on all days except Sundays and holidays. Students can also avail internet facility from Library & respective Department at free of cost.

TOTAL CAMPUS SOLUTION (TCS)

The college administration is completely automated through TCS (Total Campus Solution), an online software which provides facilities like office administration, attendance recording and study material uploading and downloading etc. Teachers, office staff, students and parents can login to the site by using their username and password.

PLACEMENT CELL

The centre offers coaching classes for entry in service for SC/ST/OBC (excluding creamy layer) and Minorities during UGC XII plan period.

REMEDIAL COACHING

Remedial classes are also conducted for core and complementary subjects as per needs. The classes are conducted at free of cost. The college is conducting remedial classes in English, complementary and core subjects. The selection of the students for remedial classes is made on the basis of a test conducted immediately after their admission. The Centre offers remedial coaching for SC/. ST/OBC (excluding creamy layer) and minorities during XII plan period.

COACHING CENTRE FOR NET/SET

The Centre offers coaching classes for National Eligibility Test (NET)/State Eliaibility Test (SET) for SC/ST/OBC (excluding creamy layer) and minority students during XII plan period.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING CELL

Realizing the needs of the fast changing world, and the opportunities thus created for our students, the college has set up a Career Guidance and Counselling Cell. The Centre offers various career guidance and counselling programmes to the students with career experts.

STUDENTS EMPLOYABILITY ENHANCEMENT CENTRE (SEEC)

The mission and endeavour of this centre is to enhance and facilitate the process of gainful employment for learner population for entry-level jobs as well as mid-career level employment opportunities. SEEC conduct various learning and development interventions to imbibe the required skills to achieve personal, resource and leader effectiveness; which are the need of the day and requirements of the world. Through SEEC, students are exposed to the various requirements of the 'Interview Preparedness'. The programmes covered under SEEC are English Language Enhancement, Business Communication, Aptitude etc. Other programs are Soft skills, under which the students are facilitated with the sessions on Self awareness. Self Motivation, Interpersonal and Intra personal Communication, Group Discussion, Debates, Interview facing, Etiquettes etc.

SIR SYED IT CENTRE

A well-equipped computer centre is functioning in the College to provide computer training for the staff and students. Students can avail this opportunity along with their regular college studies.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

With a view to improve the general tone of the college and to provide opportunities for close contact between the staff and students, the tutorial scheme has been introduced in the college. Students of the college are divided into groups and each group will be under the personal care of a teacher designated as 'tutor'. Each tutor will keep regular watch over the progress and conduct of the students of his group and advise them about their studies. The tutor shall keep a personal diary regarding the conduct, character and progress of the students under his care. The chief co-ordinator

is responsible for the implementation of the scheme. All representations of the students to the Principal / College office must be submitted through the concerned tutor with specific remarks from the tutor.

COUNSELLING CENTRE

Students Counselling Centre helps the students to deal with both personal and academic problems and enables them to identify their strengths and weaknesses, to chalk out a suitable educational / career path. Centre provides psychological counselling session, personal counselling, relaxation therapy, cognitive behaviour therapy, psychotherapy etc. to the students as and when needed.

PHOTOSTAT CENTRE

Photostat facility is available in the Library and students can utilise the service at cheaper rate.

PARENT - TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The Parent - Teacher Association plays a prominent role in the academic and physical development of the College. The Association meets at intervals to discuss various problems related to the students. PTA sponsored college buses are operated from Kannur town to College and also from Taliparamba town to College for staff and students.

GYMNASIUM

A gymnasium is housed on the campus to promote physical training. Realising the immediate need for it in the modern world, physical training and opportunity for body building are imparted there.

DISCIPLINE COMMITTEE

A permanent Discipline Committee is functioning in the College for maintaining discipline on the campus.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

A permanent Grievance Redressal Cell looks into complaints received from the students from time to time and suggests methods for their redressal. **Dr. Shefi A.E.**, Assistant Professor, Dept. of History is the convener of the cell.

CANTEEN

The canteen provides enough and delicious food at affordable rate for both staff and students. A Canteen supervising committee is constituted for monitoring the quality and hygiene.

COLLEGE CO- OPERATIVE STORE

The college co-operative store is managed by a Board of Directors elected by the share holders of the staff and students of the College. Members are eligible to get dividend declared at the annual meeting of the General Body. Books and stationery articles at reasonable rates are available in the college co-operative store.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Sir Syed Old Students' Association is very active and provides unstinting support in the process of growth and expansion of the institution. The Association has chapters in India, Dubai, Qatar, AbuDhabi, Kuwait and Bahrain. There is a monthly programme conducted by the alumni association for the students. This includes lectures and interactive sessions on academic, social, psychological or career oriented subjects of two hours duration by an eminent alumni member. The alumni association extends their support by adopting students from very poor family to complete their UG and PG programmes.

COLLEGE HOSTELS

HOSTEL RULES

- 1. Hostel is a "home away from home" and therefore, hostellers should maintain a cordial and healthy relationship with all the inmates.
- 2. Students should abide by the decisions of the hostel warden and co-operate in the enforcement of the hostel rules failing which strict disciplinary action may be taken.
- 3. Students should follow the general timetable fixed for the Hostel.
- 4. Students must keep their rooms neat and clean. They should keep their belongings in proper order.
- 5. Students should sleep only in their own allotted rooms.
- 6. Students are accountable for their belongings. The hostel authorities will not be responsible for any loss of cash or other valuables from the room.
- 7. Students should keep their rooms locked when they leave the hostel.
- 8. Save water and electricity. Use them as per requirement only.
- 9. Allotment of rooms is at the discretion of the Warden. Students should refrain from defacing walls and furniture with drawings and writings.
- 10. The hostel warden has the right to check the room at any time for maintaining order in the hostel.
- 11. Students cannot bring outsiders into the hostel. Guest may be allowed on prior written permission from the warden.
- 12. Consumption of alcohol, smoking and use of drugs and other intoxicants in the hostel and its premises are strictly prohibited. Anyone found violating the rules will be subjected to serious disciplinary action.
- Hostelers desiring to go out of the campus shall obtain permission from the warden before going out and register their whereabout in the movement register.
- 14. Admission to the hostel is on an annual basis and may not be renewed for lack of compliance with the hostel discipline. Serious breach of hostel discipline will invite dismissal from college also.
- 14. Financial commitments of the hostel shall be met on time and failure to do so will invite dismissal.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC) - BOYS AND GIRLS WING

National Cadet Corps is a premier youth organization of the country. It persistently strives to mould and refine the body and mind of the enterprising and enthusiastic student community. Its core function being nation-building, the corps endeavour to instill in the cadets, a sense of discipline and social service that will help to bring about the qualities of leadership and the spirit of adventure in them. All able bodied and interested students may enroll themselves in NCC. The objective of NCC training is the improvement of mental alacrity, cultivating a sense of discipline and responsibility, development of personality and aptitude for leadership and inculcation of the principles and practice of military service. Attendance is compulsory at parades on the days fixed. Normally parades will be held on holidays and will not interfere with the academic work. An NCC cadet with 75% or more attendance in NCC activities for two academic years will be eligible for concession of marks in the qualifying examination for the purpose of admission to higher studies.

Various incentives are given to the cadets at different levels. Seats are reserved for eligible NCC cadets for various professional courses. Weightage marks are given to eligible cadets for admission to various courses.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) was introduced in the stream of higher education in the year 1969-70, the birth centenary year of Mahatma Gandhi. The main aim of NSS is to provide opportunities to the students to acquire valuable practical experience through service to the society. It changes the temperament of students towards humanity, helps them achieve all kinds of development including leadership qualities. Eligible NSS volunteers are entitled to get 5% grace marks for further studies.

The primary objective of NSS is personality development through community service. Community activities such as construction of village roads, sanitary works, imparting education on health, communicable diseases, agriculture, pest and plant diseases etc. are taken up by the NSS volunteers. There are two NSS units in the college. Membership is open to all students.



TRACE (TRAINING FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION)

Programme is to provide best learning experience and training for various entrance examinations exclusively for the students of degree level. The admission to prime institutions in India like IIT, IISER and central universities is based on entrance examination. TRACE provides excellent coaching facilities and training programme to the students those who wish to acquire admission in these institutions.

SPORTS COUNCIL

Sports council has been constituted to provide impetus to those students interested in sports and games. The council is responsible for all sports and games activities of the college. Facilities have been provided for football, basketball, volleyball, cricket, khabadi, ball badminton, shuttle badminton, table tennis and athletics.

CULTURAL FORUM

The aim of the Cultural Forum is to organise, encourage and promote the talents among the students viz: elecution, debate, quiz, writing skill etc. Rolling trophy and cash awards for the winners in the Kannur University Inter Collegiate Elocution Competition in Malayalam and English is instituted by the cultural forum in honour of Late V.P. Mahamood Haji, the former Secretary of CDMEA.

ARTS FORUM

Arts Forum is meant to cater to the artistic talents of students. College provides ample opportunities to develop talents in different forms of art. In addition to the activities of the Fine Arts Association, students are encouraged to take part in competitions held outside the campus. The committee will supervise, monitor and co-ordinate all the fine arts activities of the students of the college for, university and state level competitions.

SCIENCE FORUM

The science forum is established to create awareness and interest among the students on science. The activities of the club are expected to stimulate the pursuit of scientific knowledge, encourage the students' potentiality to express scientific ideas and identify their field of interest in science. Students are assigned small projects which will boost their scientific zeal and help them to take up major projects, which can be beneficial to society. The students are motivated to host exhibitions in their disciplines. The club also brings in experts in each field to enlighten and guide the students on career options in science.

LADIES ASSOCIATION OF SIR SYED COLLEGE (LASS)

The main objective of LASS is to uplift social and mental status of girl students. All women students and women staff are members of the Association. Association attends to the problems of the girls. LASS ensures the gender justice on the campus.

RESEARCHERS' FORUM

This forum is meant to encourage research activity among teachers and students. Abstracts of Ph.D & M.Phil theses are published in the publication of the forum titled "SEARCH"

SWAYAM

SWAYAM is a programme initiated by Government of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz., access, equity and quality. The objective of this effort is to take the best teaching learning resources to all, including the most disadvantaged. SWAYAM seeks to bridge the digital divide for students who have hitherto remained untouched by the digital revolution and have not been able to join the mainstream of the knowledge economy. The courses hosted on SWAYAM are in 4 guadrants – (1) video lecture, (2) specially prepared reading material that can be downloaded/ printed (3) self-assessment tests through tests and quizzes and (4) an online discussion forum for clearing the doubts. Steps have been taken to enrich the learning experience by using audio-video and multi-media and state of the art pedagogy / technology. In order to ensure best quality content are produced and delivered, nine National Coordinators have been appointed: They are AICTE for self-paced courses, NPTEL for engineering, UGC for post-graduate education, CEC for under-graduate education, NCERT & NIOS for school education, IGNOU for out of the school students and, IIMB for management studies.

SOCIAL SERVICE WING

Social Service Wing of Sir Syed College aims to accelerate use of scientific knowledge for rural development and overall enhancement of lives and livelihoods of communities near by the college. The team makes use of their knowledge and experience in the management of rural community and effectively utilize the resources for educating a wide range of stake holders including farmers, children and youth. The basic aim is to bring out the potential and caliber of young minds of the society and to guide them to achieve higher goals. Social Service Wing organizes and conducts different

educational and training programme for women and school students as well as promoting women's groups to empower women and children to assure their livelihood and to live their lives self-determined. Social Service Wing mainly focuses on encouragement of organic agriculture for food security at Muyyam Village.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CELL

BOTANICAL GARDEN

HORTUS SIRSYEDICUS

Botanical Garden, Hortus sirsyedicus is a collection of plants that are scientifically ordered and maintained, documented and labelled for public education, research, conservation, and enjoyment. Ex situ conservation of the Rare, Endangered and Threatened (RET) medicinal plants of South India is the major thrust area of the garden. The mission of the Botanical Garden is to foster science education to the society and appreciate the importance of Flora. The Botanical Garden of the College founded 32 years ago in the lush green panoramic land of the campus has developed into an excellent centre of biodiversity and ex-situ conservation of tropical flora and exotic species. At the entrance on the northern side, the visitors are greeted by Green house comprising of different species of Ferns and ornamental plants. The Medicinal Plant Demonstration Garden (MPDG) was started in 2013 and at present it is the largest medicinal plant garden among the colleges of Kannur University. The garden is beneficial to the entire society and is an attraction to the local people. It also helps the students of schools and colleges to acquire knowledge about importance of medicinal plants available in and around the area and also their importance in medicine. More than 200 species are planted and it is arranged in the traditional Ayurveda like Thriphala, Thrigadu, Nalpamaram, Thriganda, Janmanakshathra Sasyangal, Dashapushpam, Dashamoolam. Wild Aroids in India and rare Bamboo species are conserved in the Garden. The Medicinal Plant Demonstration Garden funded by Kerala state medicinal Plant Board (KSMPB), Trivandrum. The garden is maintained by Dept. of Botany.



STUDENT WELFARE SCHEMES

A number of scholarships are awarded to students every year by various agencies. Students of the College are eligible for merit scholarships awarded by the Government of India, the University and State Government. In addition to the above, Cannanore District Muslim Educational Association also awards a number of scholarships to the students. Many scholarships are also available from various agencies like the Wakf Board, the Rubber Board, Sir Syed College Alumni Association (Dubai chapter) etc. Students are eligible for "Kerala State Scholarships for Arts and Science Courses" provided they have secured 50% marks and above in their qualifying examinations. The scholarships are awarded on merit cum means, subject to the number allotted each year.

Students' Aid Fund is constituted with the contribution collected from the students. A committee constituted for the purpose distributes this amount among deserving students.

VARIOUS SCHOLARSHIPS FOR UG / PG COURSES

Central and State Government offer various scholarships for talented and financially backward students. Brief descriptions of scholarships are given below: Please visit official website of collegiate education www.dcescholarship.kerala.gov.in for details. Since the scholarships are distributed through the banks students are requested to open savings bank account which is linked with adhar in a nationalized, scheduled or commercial banks with IFSC code. The attested copy of the same should be submitted with the application. A student can apply for any number of scholarships but if selected the student can avail only one scholarship at a time that ensures maximum amount.

E-GRANTZ

The SC/ST department offers fee concession to students studying in plus two, degree, post graduation, courses belonging to OBC, KPCR with annual income below 1 lakh. There is no income limit for SC/ST, OEC students for receiving fee concession. The students should apply online for the E-grantz from the Akshya Centres and the copy of the same along with income certificate, community certificate, copy of the savings bank passbook and Aadhaar card should be submitted to the head of the institution. SC/ST/OEC Students who stay in hostel will be granted hostel charges.

HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Every year Kerala State Higher Education council offers scholarship for 1000 talented students studying in I year degree in Govt. or Aided colleges. Selected students will receive Rs 1,54,000 within 5 years from I year degree programme till completing Post Graduation. Applications are invited in the month of Nov-Dec.
