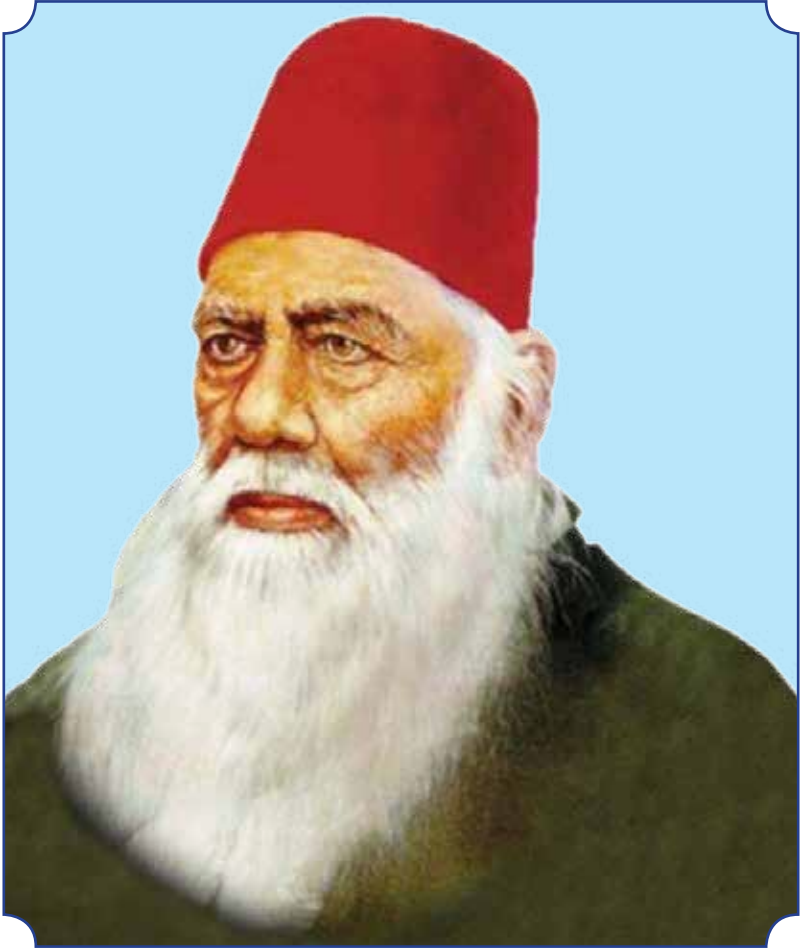

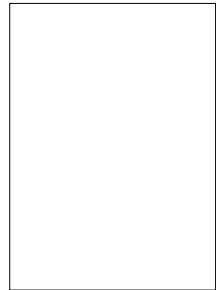

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# COLLEGE PROFILE

Sir Syed College, was established in 1967 by a handful of educational visionaries of Kannur under CDMEA (Cannanore District Muslim Educational Association) with a vision to impart moral and liberal education to the public, especially socio politically backward minority communities of North Malabar region. The college, named after Sir Syed Ahmed Khan, the founder of Aligarh Muslim University, was started in 1967 as a junior college under the University of Kerala. It came under the University of Calicut in 1968 and under the Kannur University in 1996. The institution was re-accredited by NAAC with A grade in 2025. Today Sir Syed College is one of the biggest post graduate institutions under Kannur University. The college at present offers Under Graduate programmes in Botany, Chemistry, Forestry, Physics, Mathematics, Statistics, Zoology, Arabic, Economics, Functional English, History, Malayalam, Commerce and Journalism with Multimedia and Communication; Post Graduate Programmes in Arabic, Botany, Chemistry, Physics and Commerce. Apart from that the departments of Botany, Chemistry, Commerce and Physics are research centres as well.

The college has a strength of 2040 students, 76 Faculty Members and 33 non teaching staff. Thirty six of the Faculties are Ph.D holders and 15 have M.Phil degree. There are 19 research guides attached to the research departments of Chemistry and Botany and 29 Research Scholars are working under them. 37 scholars have been awarded Ph.D from these research centres so far (24 Botany, 9 Chemistry and 4 Hindi). Many Faculties are engaged in minor and major research projects funded by various agencies. The members of the faculty have contributed extensively to literatures in their respective fields. 56 books have been published by the faculties out of which one has attained national award. About 600 research papers of faculties and students have been published in various international and national journals. The Publication division of the college publishes the research journal, SEARCH. The college boasts of an extensive library with 44000 books, 72 journals and INFLIBNET facility. The other facilities offered by the college include Sir Syed

IT Centre, UGC aided Coaching Centre, Career Guidance and Counselling Cell, Photostat Centre, Gymnasium, Health Club, Sports Pavilion, Ladies Retreat room etc. There are separate hostels for men and women and an indoor stadium funded by UGC with four court. An ambitious project of the institution, the PG and Research block as GOLDEN JUBILEE BUILDING with three floors.

The students are provided ample opportunities for co-curricular and extra curricular activities through National Cadet Corps, National Service Scheme and different clubs like Language Club, Farm Club, Forestry Club, Hindi Club, ED Club, Film Club, Music Club, Tourism Club, Literary Club, Media Club Cultural Forum, Arts Forum, Science Forum etc. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Tutorial Scheme, Grievance Redressal Cell, Parent Teachers Association, College Co-Operative Society etc. ensure that the students get an ideal environment congenial to bring out the best in them. The college office ensures that maximum number of students get scholarships and endowments. Presently more than half of the students are enjoying the benefits of different scholarships and endowments.

*Hortus Sir Syedicus*, the district medicinal plants demonstration garden developed by the Garden Club and NSS with the financial aid of State Medicinal Plants Board is one of a kind under the Kannur University. Sir Syed College is a front runner in academics with the maximum number of students becoming toppers year after year. The college has also left its mark on account of its envious success, excellent performance and participation in the arts festivals and many a time students from this institution have represented the University and State at sports meets across the country.

The institution is extremely proud that in its 58 years of glorious existence it has stood true to its mission of changing the social fabric of North Malabar region. The role played by Sir Syed College is undeniable and pivotal in the cultural, political, economic and social mapping and development of the region.

# GENERAL RULES

## ADMISSION

### U.G. Courses

Application for 4 year U.G. admission is through Kannur University centralised online platform. Those who seek admission in Muslim/ Management/ Sports quota should submit the printout of the online application with supporting documents. Candidates who have passed plus two or equivalent examination recognized by the Kannur University are eligible for UG admission. For registration and details visit [www.admission.kannuruniversity.ac.in](http://www.admission.kannuruniversity.ac.in). Uniform is compulsory for all UG students in all working days.

### PG Course

1. Application for P.G. admission is through Kannur University centralised online platform. Those who seek admission in Muslim/ Management/ Sports quota should submit the printout of the online application with supporting documents. Candidates who have completed graduation are eligible for P. G admission. For registration and details visit [www.admission.kannuruniversity.ac.in](http://www.admission.kannuruniversity.ac.in)
2. A rank list will be published online by the University.
3. Applicants who are provisionally selected for admission shall be enrolled only when they produce all the certificates mentioned in the prospectus and pay the first term fee. Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate without assigning reason thereof.
4. Any candidate who is found to have secured admission by false representation will be sent away and the fee paid by him/her shall be forfeited.

## COLLECTION OF FEE

1. The tuition fee can be paid in two installments on the days noted in the calendar. This may also be remitted in lump sum in advance.
2. The special fee, caution deposit etc. should be paid along with the first installment of tuition fee on the day of admission. Students of senior classes should remit the same within seven days from the re-opening of the College.
3. If any student fails to pay the fee on the due date, he/she shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs. 10/- along with the fee on or before the 10th day after the due date. If the 10th day happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be reckoned as the 10th day.

4. If the fee and fine are not paid within the last opportunity, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College. He/she will not be eligible for attendance until he/she is re-admitted. If he /she is to be re-admitted he /she has to apply for the special permission of the Principal and remit Rs.50/- as re-admission fee.
5. Full fee concession is granted to students belonging to the scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other eligible communities. Students belonging to other backward communities and forward castes shall produce necessary Income, Nativity and Community Certificates at the time of admission.
6. Other Backward Community students who leave the College during the middle of the academic year are not eligible for fee concession and they have to pay all fee due at the time of their leaving.
7. Students from other Universities shall pay the matriculation and recognition fee at the time of admission and apply for recognition of the qualifying examination.

## **CAUTION DEPOSIT**

1. The caution deposit will be refunded to the students only after the completion of the course or when the students leave the institution. They should produce the original receipt issued at the time of admission.
2. All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be preferred before the re-opening date of the next academic year. After this time limit the names of those who have not claimed the deposit will be published in the dailies and if the claim for refund is not preferred within two months from the date of publication, the whole amount due to the student shall be permanently forfeited and the same will be remitted to the Government.

## **TRANSFER CERTIFICATE**

1. Application for Transfer Certificate should be made in the prescribed form at least two days in advance.
2. Conduct Certificate will be issued only along with the Transfer Certificate when the student has completed the course.
3. A late fee of Rs.55/- will be collected from those who apply for T.C. after one year of his / her leaving the College. The date of leaving the College will ordinarily be the last day he/ she attended the College.
4. A fine of Rs.100/- will have to be paid for the issue of duplicate T.C.
5. Duplicate T.C. will be issued only on the production of an affidavit signed before a First Class Judicial Magistrate.



## ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. Every student shall put in a minimum attendance of 75% of term days, with the exception of girls students, who require only 72% attendance.
2. Students are not permitted to be absent themselves from classes without leave. Leave applications should be submitted to the Principal in advance through the class Tutor/ Head of the Department.
3. Percentage of attendance is calculated on the basis of hours attended.
4. Applications for leave on medical grounds shall be submitted with a medical certificate.
5. A student who is absent from the College with or without leave for more than five consecutive working days shall report to the Principal before attending any class.
6. If a student is absent from the College for more than 15 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation, his/her name will be removed from the rolls.
7. Promotion to the higher class/next semester and the eligibility to write University Examination shall be subjected to the following conditions:
  - a) The student should have earned at least three fourth of the attendance prescribed by the College for the course during the semester.
  - b) He/she should have completed the course to the satisfaction of the College authorities and his/her progress, conduct and character should have been satisfactory.
8. 8 Students seeking exemption from the rules related to minimum attendance shall apply for exemption to the University. The reason for each day's absence is to be explained. In the case of absence on account of illness, a medical certificate has also to be furnished.
9. The semester certificate of attendance required by the University for University Examinations will not be granted unless the Principal is satisfied that the student's conduct and progress have been satisfactory and the student has attended the classes in three fourth of the working days in the academic semester. Students may also note that unless they register for the University Examinations, they will not be eligible for promotion to higher classes. Students who want to participate in extracurricular and curricular activities will not be granted grace attendance unless they obtain prior written permission from the Principal. Applications for such permission shall be recommended by the teachers concerned.

No application for exemption will be recommended by the Principal unless he is satisfied that the shortage of attendance was beyond the student's control. In no case will exemption be granted to the same student for more than 2 times in a course.

# DISCIPLINARY RULES

Students are hereby instructed to strictly follow the disciplinary rules of the college. Ignorance of rules is no excuse. Students are expected to read the notice board on a day to day basis. It is the duty of every student to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and conduct himself/herself with decency and decorum. Violation of the rules will result in disciplinary action against the offenders and imposition of punishment including dismissal.

## IDENTITY CARDS COMPULSORY

All students admitted to the college shall compulsorily wear their identity cards whenever they are present on the college campus. All payments, issue of certificates, mark lists etc. will be made only on production of the identity card. The identity card shall be surrendered to the office at the time of claiming the refund of caution deposit or issuing of Transfer Certificate/Qualifying Certificate whichever is earlier. Identity Card is valid for one year only.

## MANDATORY DRESS CODE

UG students should wear uniform prescribed by the college authorities. Transparent and exposing clothes, T shirts are to be avoided. Boys shall not tuck their dhoti up while they are on the campus. Students should not cover their face and should reveal their identity while they are on the campus.

## OUTSIDERS NOT PERMITTED

Outsiders are not permitted to meet any of the staff or students on the college campus without the permission of the principal. Students shall not bring any outsider except the parent/guardian to the college premises for any purpose whatsoever without the permission of the principal.

## CHARACTER AND CONDUCT

1. Conduct Certificate will not be issued as a matter of course. It has to be earned by the student's good conduct and behaviour. The decision of the Principal shall be final regarding this matter.
2. Students shall greet both teaching and non teaching staff on the occasion of their first meeting during the day.

3. When the Principal or teacher enters a classroom, students shall stand and greet and keep standing till they are asked to sit down.
4. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms before the teaching hour commences.
5. Students should be seated in their respective class rooms by 9.25 AM and should not leave the classes except during intervals.
6. When a student wants to enter or leave the classroom while the class is on, he/she shall do so only after getting the permission of the teacher.
7. During the absence of the teacher and while moving from one class to another, students should keep silence.
8. Students shall not loiter on the verandas or college premises during working hours for any reason whatsoever.
9. Students are advised to use the library during free periods.
10. Students shall not enter any class other than their own.
11. No indecent representation shall be made by any student towards any other students either in words, letters, gestures or by any other means.
12. Videography and photography that discredits the College is prohibited.
13. Adventurous Jeep/car/bike racing are banned in the campus.

## **RAGGING: A SERIOUS CRIMINAL OFFENCE**

Students shall not indulge in ragging or in any other activities causing harassment or difficulties to the fellow students in the college. Any student involving in ragging will be expelled from the college and have to face penal proceedings in accordance with the provisions in the Ragging Prohibition Act of the Govt. of Kerala.

## **OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Smoking and consumption of alcohol are strictly prohibited in the campus. Students shall not use or bring tobacco or its products, intoxicating drinks or narcotic substances to the college.
2. Students shall not go on tour or picnic or excursion without the written permission of the Principal.

3. Prior written permission of the Principal is necessary for organizing processions, meetings, entertainment programmes, functions in the college for collecting funds from the students/staff and for distributing notice or putting up any notice on the notice board.
4. Students shall not cause any loss or damage to the college property. Intentional causing of loss or damage will be considered a serious misconduct. The offenders will be penalised for the same and will be liable for recovery of the loss.
5. Students shall not write or make any marks on the walls or any part of the college property. If found guilty, they are liable to be punished and the expenses for the repair work will be recovered from the offenders.
6. A student who has any complaint against any other students, teaching staff or non teaching staff shall represent the same either in writing or orally to the Tutor, HoD, Grievance Redressal Cell and Discipline Committee or to the Principal directly. Such representations can be made by the parents/ guardians of the students also.

## **MISCONDUCT AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION**

1. Students are bound to obey the directions issued from time to time by the Principal, teachers and the authorities. Disobedience to such directions would amount to serious misconduct.
2. Any student, who is found to have behaved himself/herself in any indecent or disorderly manner inside or outside the class room on the college premises is liable to be punished as deemed fit by the Principal.
3. A teacher may send a student out of the class if the student misbehaves in the class. If any student is sent out of the class, the teacher and the student shall report the matter to the Principal.
4. The Principal shall have the power to inflict punishments such as imposing fine, cancellation of attendance, withholding the term certificate, forfeiting educational concession and scholarship, suspension, compulsory issue of TC without the application from the student or guardian and expulsion from the college.

# CODE OF CONDUCT

## TEACHERS AND THEIR RIGHTS

The Teachers shall enjoy full civic and political rights as provided by the Indian Constitution. The teachers shall have the right to adequate emoluments, academic freedom, social position, conditions of service, professional independence and adequate social insurance.

A teacher shall:

- Adhere to a responsible pattern of conduct and demeanor expected of him/her by his/her peers and the community.
- Manage his/her private affairs in a manner consistent with the dignity of the profession.
- Seek to make professional growth continuous through study and research, writing and decent conduct.
- Express free and frank opinion by active participation at professional meetings, seminars, conferences, etc. towards the contribution of knowledge.
- Maintain active membership of professional organizations, subscribing academic/subject periodicals, and strive to improve education and profession through them.
- Perform his/her duties in the form of teaching, tutorial, practical and seminar work conscientiously and with dedication.
- Co-operate and assist in carrying out functions relating to the educational responsibilities of the University such as: assisting in appraising applications for admission, advising and counseling students as well as assisting in the conduct of University and College examinations, including supervision, invigilation and evaluation, and participate in extension, co-curricular and extracurricular activities including community service.

## TEACHERS AND THE STUDENTS

The teacher shall;

- Respect the right and dignity of the student in expressing his/her opinion.
- Deal justly and impartially with students regardless of their religion, caste, sex, political, economic, social and physical status.
- Recognize the difference in aptitude and capabilities among students and strive to meet their individual needs.
- Encourage students to improve their attainments, develop their personalities and at the same time contribute to community welfare.
- Inculcate among students scientific, progressive and rational outlook and respect for physical labour and ideals of democracy, patriotism and peace.
- Be affectionate to the students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason.
- Make himself/herself available to the students even beyond their class hours and help and guide them without any remuneration or reward.
- Aid students to develop an understanding of our national heritage and national goals, and refrain from inciting students against other students, colleagues or administration.

## TEACHERS AND COLLEAGUES

The teachers shall always;

- Treat other members of the profession in the same manner as they themselves wish to be treated, speak respectfully of other teachers and render assistance for professional betterment.
- Refrain from lodging unsubstantiated allegations against colleagues to higher authorities.
- Refrain from exploiting considerations of caste, creed, religion, race or gender in their professional endeavour,
- Be thoroughly social and humane, democratic and rational, towards other teachers,
- Strive at any cost to remove and wash out the local tensions and controversies and disputes.
- Believe in union and unity of the colleagues.

## TEACHERS AND AUTHORITIES

The teachers shall;

- Discharge their professional responsibilities according to the existing rules and adhere to procedure and methods consistent with their profession in initiating steps through their own institutional bodies and/or professional
- Organizations for change of any such rule detrimental to the professional interest.
- Not undertake any other employment and commitment including private tuitions and coaching classes.
- Co-operate in the formulation of policies of the institution by accepting various offices and discharge responsibilities which such offices may demand.
- Co-operate with the authorities for the betterment of the institutions keeping in view the interest and in conformity with dignity of the profession.
- Refrain from availing themselves of leave except on unavoidable grounds and as far as practicable with prior intimation, keeping in view their particular responsibility for completion of academic schedule.

## TEACHERS AND NON-TEACHING EMPLOYEES

- The teachers should treat the non-teaching employees as colleagues and equal partners in a co-operative undertaking, within every educational institution.
- The teachers should help in the function of joint staff council covering both teachers and the non-teaching employees.

# COLLEGE LIBRARY

The college has a well equipped library with 44,000+ books and 72 journals. The library will be open from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days including Saturdays.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Identity card issued by the College should be brought while entering the library.
2. Personal articles such as books, bags, umbrellas, files etc., are not allowed in the library.
3. Students are allowed to keep only blank sheets of paper and pen in the library.
4. Library is a place for serious reading and research. Strict silence should be maintained in the library and its premises.
5. Students can get the books issued from the library by producing the identity card.
6. The students should examine the book issued to them and any damage, marking if any, should be reported to the staff before leaving the counter.
7. The students will be held responsible for any defect detected when the book is returned and he /she will be liable to replace the defective book with a new one or pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Government/University.
8. The loan period is normally 14 days. But the Librarian reserves the right to recall any book at any time from any student, staff even when the period of loan is not over.





9. The loan period may be extended or shortened at the discretion of the Librarian
10. If the book issued from the library is not returned on or before the due date, a fine of one rupee per day will be levied for each book.
11. If a book issued is lost, the matter should immediately be reported to the Librarian
12. If a book is irrecoverably lost, it must be replaced with a new one or the cost as may be fixed by the Government/University should be paid.
13. Member shall not sub lend the books of the library.
14. All documents issued from the Library to the students and the members of the staff should be returned on or before the last working day of the academic year or on the date fixed by the Librarian.
15. Any matter not covered by the forgoing rules shall be decided by the principal.

## BOOK BANK

1. The Book Bank is a separate section of the college library and contains standard text books of all subjects. They are loaned to financially backward students for a period of one year ending on 31st March.
2. Books will be issued to deserving students recommended by the Heads of Departments. Those who need the books should apply to the librarian with the recommendation of the Head of the Department, the librarian will issue the books on obtaining acknowledgment in the issue register.
3. Generally two text books only will be issued to a student from the book bank.
4. If the book is not returned on the prescribed day, a fine of 1 rupee per day will be levied.
5. A student is allowed to get the same book renewed for second year on 1st June in case it is so recommended by the Head of the Department.
6. Books are to be used with maximum care and there should be no damage or disfigurement. Writing with pencil or ink anywhere in the book is strictly forbidden. If any such thing has been done, the student is liable to replace the book. Books will be received only after page to page scrutiny.

# STUDENTS SUPPORT SYSTEMS

## **MOODLE-LMS (LEARNING MANAGEMENT SYSTEM)**

Moodle Learning Management System is designed to help students and faculties. Its many tools can be used to provide students with course documents, foster communication among class members and engage students in active learning outside of the classroom. The features of Moodle are personalized dashboard creation, easy to use interface, collaborative tools, automatic alerts and notifications, customized role creation, etc.

## **Wi-Fi - INTERNET FACILITY**

College has become a Wi-Fi campus with high-speed Internet connection through optical fibre cabling funded by Department of Science and Technology (DST) FIST Programme and University Grants Commission (UGC) from 2015 onwards. Sir Syed College IT Centre and Network Resource Centre in the Library are well equipped with computers exclusively set aside for browsing. To promote the use of Internet for academic purpose, students are allowed Wi-Fi access to Internet in their laptop or tablet free of cost..

## **TUTORIAL SYSTEM**

With a view to improve the general tone of the college and to provide opportunities for close contact between the staff and students, the tutorial scheme has been introduced in the college. Students of the college are divided into groups and each group will be under the personal care of a teacher designated as 'tutor'. Each tutor will keep regular watch over the progress and conduct of the students of his group and advise them about their studies. The tutor shall keep a personal diary regarding the conduct, character and progress of the students under his/her care. The chief co-ordinator is responsible for the implementation of the scheme.

## **TOTAL CAMPUS SOLUTION (TCS)**

The college administration is completely automated through TCS (Total Campus Solution), an Online software which provides facilities like office administration, attendance recording and study material uploading and downloading etc. Teachers, office staff, students and parents can login to the site by using their user's name and password.

## **PLACEMENT CELL**

The Placement Cell plays a crucial role in locating job opportunities for Under Graduates and Post Graduates passing out from the college by keeping in touch with reputed firms and industrial establishments. The Placement Cell operates round the year to facilitate contacts between companies and graduates. The number of students placed through the campus interviews is continuously rising..

## **STUDENTS EMPLOYABILITY ENHANCEMENT CENTRE (SEEC)**

The mission and endeavor of this centre is to enhance and facilitate the process of gainful employment for learner population for entry-level jobs as well as mid-career level employment opportunities. SEEC conduct various learning and development interventions to imbibe the required skills to achieve personal, resource and leader effectiveness; which are the need of the day and requirements of the world. Through SEEC, students are exposed to the various requirements of the 'Interview Preparedness'. There are 4 buses for transportation. Among which two of them shuttles in and around Kannur and the other two buses in Pazhayangadi and Irikkur. Buses maintain good timing. Daily updates are given through whatsapp for each bus. Buses also have a good maintenance schedule that gives effective functioning in transportation of students.

## **INNOVATION AND ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CENTRE (IEDC)**

The Innovation Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) are the entities set up in our college by Kerala Startup Mission to provide an exciting platform for experimentation and innovation. Sir Syed College IEDC provide avenues for creative students to transform their innovative ideas into viable products and services. IEDCs works as the first launch pad for a student's entrepreneurial journey and provide them with access to cutting edge technology, world class infrastructure, high quality mentorship, early risk capital and global exposure. The mission of the IEDCs is to "develop institutional mechanism to create an entrepreneurial culture in academic institutions to foster growth of innovation and entrepreneurship amongst the faculty and students". IEDC is arranging Faculty Development Programs (FDP), Entrepreneurship Awareness Programs, Skill development programs, institutional level ED Fests etc for the students to create Job Providers instead of Job Seekers.

## **PREMARITAL COUNSELLING CENTRE**

Sir syed college premarital counselling centre started in 2018 under Kerala state Minority Welfare Department. Premarital counselling is being conducted under the centre which discuss areas such as preparation ahead of married life, ethical and legal issues in married life, educational and job prospects after marriage etc., managed about 21 and womanv above 18 could register in the program. The course is being conducted to the students in college as well as in extension centres. The course is divided into 8 sessions of 3 hours each. Certificate will be given on successful completion of the course.

## **SEDGE CARE PROGRAMME**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 identifies SEDGs as people from under-represented sections, socio-cultural identities (such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, and minorities), geographical identities (such as students from villages, small towns, and aspirational districts), disabilities (including learning disabilities), socio-economic conditions and gender identities to make them more inclusive, equitable, and sensitive, college has formed a program under SEDGs (Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups) care programme .

Bridge courses for addressing problems of students belonging to Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Groups (SEDGs) with learning deficiencies, earn- while-learn scheme, outreach programmes are conducted by various departments to take to assimilate such students into the education system and reduce drop-outs.



## **SC/ST CELL**

# STUDENTS' ACCOMMODATION

## COLLEGE HOSTELS

There are two hostels maintained by the College. (i) the Malikdeenar Hostel for Men and (ii) the Ladies Hostel. Students of the College should reside either in the College Hostel or with their parents.

(i) Admission to hostels is for one year only.

(ii) Principal is the chief warden; he is the final authority to grant admission/re-admission. Residents of the hostels shall strictly adhere to the directions/rules framed by the College authorities. Violation of such rules will entail his/ her expulsion from the hostel /dismissal from the College.

## HOSTEL RULES

1. Hostel is a “home away from home” and therefore, hostellers should maintain a cordial and healthy relationship with all the inmates.
2. Students should abide by the decisions of the hostel warden and co-operate with enforcement of the hostel rules failing which strict disciplinary action will be taken.
3. Students should follow the general timetable fixed for the Hostel.
4. Students must keep their rooms neat and clean. They should keep their belongings in proper order.
5. Students should sleep only in their own allotted rooms.
6. Students are accountable for their belongings. The hostel authorities will not be responsible for any loss of cash or other valuables from the room.
7. Students should keep their rooms locked when they leave the hostel.
8. Conserve water and electricity. Use them as per requirement only.
9. Allotment of rooms is at the discretion of the Warden. Students should refrain from defacing walls and furniture with drawings and writings.
10. The hostel warden has the right to check the room at any time for maintaining order in the hostel.
11. Students cannot bring outsiders into the hostel. Guest may be allowed on prior written permission from the warden.
12. Consumption of alcohol, smoking and use of drugs and other intoxicants in the hostel and its premises are strictly prohibited. Anyone found violating the rules will be subjected to serious disciplinary action.
13. Hostellers desiring to go out of the campus shall obtain permission from the warden before going out and register their whereabouts in the movement register.
14. Going out of the hostel anywhere other than to college needs the prior permission of the warden.
15. No student is allowed to stay in the hostel during the working hours/ class time except with the prior permission of the warden.
16. Misusing the Internet/mobile phone facilities will be dealt with seriously.
17. Any kind of ragging, intimidation or aggressive behavior from students’ part is forbidden
18. Admission to the hostel is on an annual basis and may not be renewed for lack of compliance with the hostel discipline. Serious breach of hostel discipline will invite dismissal from college also. Financial commitments of the hostel shall be met on time and failure to do so will invite dismissal.

Its core function being nation-building, the corps endeavour to instill in the cadets, a sense of discipline and social service that will help to bring about the qualities of leadership and the spirit of adventure in them. All able bodied and interested students may enroll themselves in NCC. The objective of NCC training is the improvement of mental alacrity, cultivating a sense of discipline and responsibility, development of personality and aptitude for leadership and inculcation of the principles and practice of military service. Attendance is compulsory at parades on the days fixed. Normally parades will be held on holidays and will not interfere with the academic work. An NCC cadet with 75% or more attendance in NCC activities for three academic years will be eligible for concession of marks in the qualifying examination for the purpose of admission to higher studies.

Various incentives are given to the cadets at different levels. Seats are reserved for eligible NCC cadets for various professional courses. Weightage marks are given to eligible cadets for admission to various courses.

First year undergraduate graduate students are eligible to join NSS. After completing two years volunteership and seven days special camp (residential camp) are entitled to get NSS certificate, grace mark in the university examination and 5% grace marks for higher studies.

The primary objective of NSS is personality development through community service. Community activities such as construction of village roads, imparting education, various awareness programs, blood donation camp, agriculture activities, etc. are taken up by the NSS volunteers. We have two NSS units in the college, unit no 14 and 15 Kannur University. In the academic year 2022-23 two NSS volunteers got selection for national camp organised by the ministry of youth affairs, Government of India.

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# BOTANICAL GARDEN

## ***HORTUS SIRSYEDICUS***

Botanical Garden, Hortus sirsyedicus is a collection of plants that are scientifically ordered and maintained, documented and labelled for public education, research, conservation, and enjoyment. Ex situ conservation of the Rare, Endangered and Threatened (RET) medicinal plants of South India is the major thrust area of the garden. The mission of the Botanical Garden is to foster science education to the society and appreciate the importance of Flora. The Botanical Garden of the College founded 32 years ago in the lush green panoramic land of the campus has developed into an excellent centre of biodiversity and ex-situ conservation of tropical flora and exotic species. At the entrance on the northern side, the visitors are greeted by Green house comprising of different species of Ferns and ornamental plants. The Medicinal Plant Demonstration Garden (MPDG) was started in 2013 and at present it is the largest medicinal plant garden among the colleges of Kannur University. The garden is beneficial to the entire society and is an attraction to the local people. It also helps the students of schools and colleges to acquire knowledge about importance of medicinal plants available in and around the area and also their importance in medicine. More than 200 species are planted and it is arranged in the traditional Ayurveda like Thriphala, Thrigadu, Nalpamaram, Thriganda, Janmanakshathra Sasyangal, Dashapushpam, Dashamoolam. Wild Aroids in India and rare Bamboo species are conserved in the Garden. The Medicinal Plant Demonstration Garden is funded by Kerala state medicinal Plant Board (KSMPB), Trivandrum. The garden is maintained by Dept. of Botany.



Dr. Paramasivam Manisankar, Former Vice-Chancellor of Bharathidasan University and Chairperson of the NAAC Peer Team, planted a tree at the front of the Botanical Garden to commemorate the NAAC Peer Team visit during the fourth cycle of re-accreditation. The function was held in the presence of other Peer Team members, the Manager, the Chairman of the Governing Body, the Principal and faculty and staff members from the Department of Botany.

# STUDENT WELFARE SCHEMES

A number of scholarships are awarded to students every year by various agencies. Students of the College are eligible for merit scholarships awarded by the Government of India, the University and the State Government. In addition to the above, Cannanore District Muslim Educational Association also awards a number of scholarships to the students. Many scholarships are also available from various agencies like the Wakf Board, the Rubber Board, Sir Syed College Alumni Association (Dubai chapter) etc. Students who have secured 50% marks and above in their qualifying examination are eligible for “Kerala State Scholarships for Arts and Science Courses.”. The scholarships are awarded on merit cum means, subject to the number allotted each year.

Such students are provided financial help in pursuing their studies. The fund for financial aid is collected from the faculties of college who voluntarily contribute the amount monthly. SAFE committee is formed by selecting one member from each Dept. The beneficiaries of the scheme are selected by the committee on the recommendation of tutors. It is one of the best practices of the college.

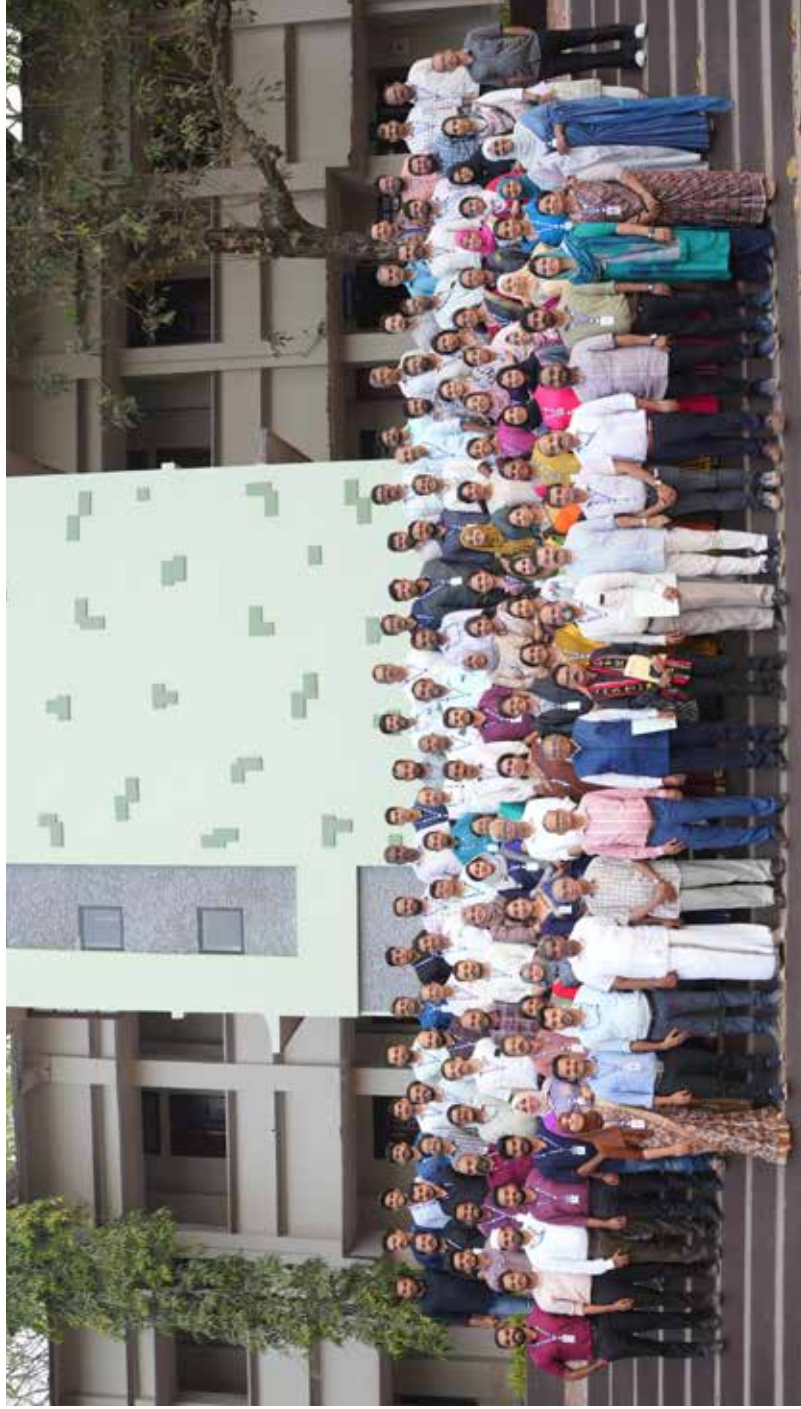
